## Sponsorship Program

At Symbios we are committed to rescue orphaned children and place them in caring communities. Through fostering partnering relationships with the West and under-developed countries and multiplying these communities, we hope all involved will find life, significance and purpose.

### What is Sponsorship?

Sponsorship is a symbiotic relationship where you can personally support a child from an under-developed country. Your sponsorship support will provide clothing, housing, clean water and food, education, medical and dental care to a child in need.

For your investment, you will receive information about your sponsored child and a current photograph. You will also receive regular reports of the activities at Symbios, where your sponsored child receives the benefits of your sponsorship.

## There Are Two Types Of Sponsorship:

### [1] EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP

Each sponsorship costs \$35/month and goes towards the costs of the child's education; school uniforms, books, supplies, teachers, etc.

### [2] CHILDREN'S HOME SPONSORSHIP

Each sponsorship costs \$35/month and goes towards orphanage/home costs such as food, shelter, clothing, and other basic needs.







## Horizon Initiative

Horizon Initiative is an organization founded with a core competency of “empowering the poor to reach self-sustainability”. We achieve this through developing micro-communities that are backed by Corporate Sponsorship Partners. By “empowering the poor” to attack the World’s central challenge of alleviating poverty, we implicitly believe it is not just about “giving money” in our effort to alleviate poverty, rather developing self-sustaining people/communities. We are defined primarily by our micro-community initiatives funded by venture capitalists, strategic corporate sponsorships, and our wealth generation initiatives.

A micro-community is a compound consisting of, and anchored by, an orphanage/home that also includes modules such as farm units, livestock units, medical clinics and schools (academic/trade) and, in certain cases, on-site social/micro-businesses. The goal is to attain the highest percentage of economic sustainability for those individuals and the communities where they reside. “Symbios” is our registered NGO (non-governmental organization) located in Kenya.

## Baba Nyumbani (pictured above)

Baba Nyumbani is our first full service micro-community. It is situated on 5 acres in Western Kenya near the city of Kitale. We have completed construction on our dorms, our kitchen and dining hall, and trade school. Our well is producing enough water for several communities. We have a garden which is producing a variety of vegetables and fruits. Our next phase will include a poultry project which will produce eggs to feed and help sustain the micro-community. When full orphan sponsorship is attained we will have 90+ orphans on-site that in addition to receiving food, shelter, and care will be going to school and learning how to become self-sustainable as they mature into adulthood.



# WITH HORIZON INITIATIVE'S MICRO COMMUNITY MODEL

## EMPOWERMENT IS THE TOOL, SELF-SUSTAINABILITY IS THE GOAL

### The Horizon Initiative Promise

In 2004, a group of North American leaders gathered to form Horizon Initiative, a 501c3 "not for profit" organization based in Pennsylvania. This group has evolved to a board of Venture Capitalists dedicated to generate wealth to empower the poor in some of the most disadvantaged regions of the world. Through their streamlined administrative approach to expenses, which are 100% covered by board contributions, their leadership and influence in forging strategic corporate sponsorship opportunities and community partnerships, and their \$1M capitalization initiative which allows for a solid foundation of future growth, the members of Horizon Initiative are dedicated to alleviating poverty through their Micro Community Initiatives.

### The Horizon Initiative Micro Community Model

A micro community is organically established within an underdeveloped country where Horizon Initiative has found strategic partnerships with people and organizations that are embedded in the country. A fully developed micro community consists of a compound that includes an orphanage (dorms, dining hall, recreation facilities), which serves as the anchor of the micro community. Combined with educational, farming, and medical facilities, and, in some cases, social/micro businesses, a micro community rescues orphaned children first, and empowers children second.

Leveraging trusted and tested relationships in the country we locate, acquire land, and construct appropriate infrastructure consisting of buildings, utilities and other basic resources result in defining the benchmarks for sustaining a successful micro community. While orphan residential care is the only model today, we intend to move into home-based care and board school care in the future.

Funding is provided, at the onset, for each micro community through capital campaigns with our corporate partners, VC board members, and/or underwritten through our wealth generation initiatives. We always have an objective to have a micro community become self-sustainable.

The micro community is also focused on providing opportunities to the community-at-large, such as being able to participate in resources like academic and trade schools, medical clinics, micro loans, and infrastructure projects (wells, electricity) to aid the community in becoming economically self-sustainable.

It is our goal during the life cycle of a child living in our micro community environment that he/she, by the time they reach the age of accountability, can become:

- Self sufficient
- Capable of sustaining their immediate future and extended family needs
- Able to provide positive contributions to community sustainability
